



Finn was your average fun-loving 5-year-old. He loved music, dancing, roughhousing with his 6-year-old brother Declan and all things Lego. It was a random day that he said his back was hurting a little. The pediatrician suggested Motrin and to call back in a few days if it didn't feel better.

Fast forward a month and still hurting, only now he could barely sit in a car seat without wincing in pain. It was the first day of Kindergarten. By Wednesday morning he could barely walk, so to the ER we went. Finn was admitted and given an MRI Thursday morning which showed a tumor on his spine and he was rushed into emergency surgery. We were given a diagnosis of Ewings Sarcoma. Surgery was 9 hours, waiting for diagnosis another 10. We suddenly were facing the worst fear any parent has: the mortality of their child. Odds of 5 year survival on initial diagnosis of localized disease 80%.

Over the next year, Finn endured 8 surgeries, chemotherapy infusions, blood transfusions, platelet transfusions and hospital stays. He had to learn to walk again, missed his kindergarten year and precious family time with his best bud Declan. By May 2019 he rang the bell of end of treatment.

The summer brought fun in the sun, family time, beach trips and his Dream trip to Disney through Children's Dream Fund organization.

August marked the start of first grade. By week 2 of school Finn had his first 3 month follow up MRI where we were devastated to find out there was a new mass in a new location on his spine. Relapse. Odds of 5 year survival at relapse 30%.

We cannot be more grateful for the amazing team at St. Joseph Children's Hospital. The amazing care they have shown Finn and our family has been unbelievable; at times we felt like the only patient in the hospital. While this is certainly the journey no child should have to endure, yet he did it with grace, determination and that "ya sure" attitude along the way.

Sadly after several failed chemotherapy protocols, radiation and a trip to Boston for a specialized trial Finn passed away January 21, 2020 peacefully surrounded by family and his beloved Barkey, 30 days after relapse.

Today, we continue to #FightWithFinn to bring financial assistance and specialized experiences to the families of Tampa Bay while advocating for pediatric cancer awareness and increasing our focus on mental health care.

FROM OUR CHIEF MOMCOLOGOIST

Meet Christen, who believes the success of Finn's Fighters is a reflection of the passion they have for helping families in need and the continued support of the Tampa Bay community.

When Finn was diagnosed, our family was your typical dual income household with 2 children in elementary school balancing jobs, homework and weekend play dates. Finn's treatment required hospital stays every other week, often with fever induced hospital stays in between. In order to have a parent with him at all times I had to quit my job. While our income drastically reduced, our bills were skyrocketing. If it weren't for our amazing group of family and friends we never would have gotten through it. We were extremely blessed that we could make that decision, however during hospital stays we saw many kids alone because family had to work, they had no other choice. It was truly heartbreaking

It was during one of those hospital stays that Finn's Fighters was born. After thoughtful consideration to Finn's privacy, it was his decision to say "ya sure" and name the organization.



Through the unimaginable, our family is dedicated to support others the way our community supported us.

FINN'S FOUNDATION

Finn's Fighters began in May of 2019, with our first donation as an official 501c3 to St. Joseph's Hospitals Foundation Christmas in July. Christen, Declan and Finn brought donations of toys and gift cards to celebrate the end of his treatment. Later that year they adopted a family that was struggling because they no longer had services available as an off treatment family. While they celebrated survivorship, they were financially bankrupt.

Finn's Funds

Our Grant program is meant to assist families with short term financial assistance based on need. We have paid rents, mortgages, car payments, utility bills, travel expense, funerals and more. We have also partnered with a family who owns a beach condo to send families on a respite getaway to relax and enjoy some fun in the sun. Sadly, we have also paid for funeral expenses for multiple families.

Advocacy and Education

It surprises many that after accidents, cancer is the second leading cause of death in children ages 1 to 14 and the number one cause of death by disease. About 1,040 children under the age of 15 are expected to die from cancer in 2023. Along with taking any opportunity to speak on pediatric cancer awareness, Christen travels to DC each September to Curefest and also speaks during Action Days requesting more funding each year.

Partner Support

Finn's Fighters proudly supports through volunteerism and sponsorship with Savvy Giving by Design and Angling for Relief, two local organizations that support children facing pediatric cancer in Tampa Bay.

STATISTICS OF COMMUNITY

The pediatric cancer community has been historically underserved by the government and often requires families like the Gray's to fight for services as well as increased funding. For example, Only about 4% of all federal funding for cancer research is spent on projects involving children's cancers.



Grant Writing for Operational Costs

We are committed to find a partner organization or grant to cover organizational costs to support a salary for Executive Director and administrative assistant. Cost could equate to \$40k to 60K.

02

Friends of Finn

New program that would provide a \$500 Finn's Fighter Gift Card along with a list of community resources to help. With 66 new diagnoses alone at St. Joseph in 2022, this equates to a minimum of \$33,000.

03

FINNspirations

Working to send bereaved families on a respite trip with a message of hope as they transition into a new phase of life without their loved one. Cost could equate to \$2,500 to \$5,000 per trip.
